

NEW HOMES

We supported two Traveller women to speak at the Planning Inquiry for a Brighton site, which got the site built! 12 families are now free from the constant stress of evictions and have a safe, secure place to call home after 25 years on the road.



ACHIEVEMENTS THIS YEAR

Here are a few of the projects we have worked on this year that we feel particularly proud of and that we would like to share with you.

NATIONAL CAMPAIGNS

PLANNING

We campaigned vigorously against changes to the Planning definition of Gypsies & Travellers and proposals to scrap Local Authorities' requirement to assess the need for pitches (GTAAAs).

With partners, we reached over 250 of the House of Lords to tell them of the impact on Gypsies and Travellers. Despite losing the vote,

we heard Peers speak passionately against the scrapping of GTAAAs during the debates and almost 100 Peers voted with us.

The planning definition now excludes Gypsies and Travellers who have ceased travelling permanently, such as for ill-health or old age. The next step is judicial review to try to overturn this.

HEALTH

We published our National Gypsy & Traveller Health Inclusion campaign report which showed decision makers how to commission and provide better health care for Gypsies & Travellers.

RESEARCH THAT GIVES BACK

TRAVELLERS WHO TOOK PART IN OUR RESEARCH INTO BOWEL AND BLADDER PROBLEMS WERE GIVEN SUPPORT IN RETURN TO IMPROVE THEIR OWN HEALTH. THE REPORT ITSELF HELPS HEALTH AUTHORITIES ROUND THE COUNTRY TO IMPROVE SERVICES FOR TRAVELLERS.

***GEMMA IS A PROFOUNDLY DEAF CHILD WANTING TO STUDY DRAMA AND DANCE. WE HELPED HER GET A GRANT FOR A COMPUTER TO HELP HER ACHIEVE HER GCSES AND SUPPORTED MUM TO ACCESS CARERS SUPPORT. THEY HELPED MUM GET A PHONE TO FACE-TIME GEMMA, GIVING GEMMA MORE INDEPENDENCE AS THEY CAN LIP READ AND SIGN TOGETHER BY PHONE.**

SUPPORTING INDIVIDUALS

***MARY'S** home was vandalised with racist graffiti and 2 of her children were the victims of a racially motivated attack. We supported the family to report the race hate crimes to the police and the local authority and to get her moved to a safe home.


***PATRICK** is a disabled Traveller with learning difficulties who didn't have proper washing facilities on his site. The local authority had refused a Disabled Facilities Grant but intervention by FFT got the local authority to grant a walk in, accessible shower on the family's plot and secure disability benefits. ***names have been changed**

CRYSTAL'S VARDO

NOW IN ITS 4TH YEAR, CRYSTAL'S VARDO CONTINUED ITS JOURNEY AROUND THE COUNTRY. THE DIVERSITY OF OUR AUDIENCES IS GROWING AND WHAT STARTED OUT AS A PLAY FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN HAS NOW FOUND ITS WAY TO HEALTH CONFERENCES, TRAINING EVENTS, PRISONS AND THEATRES WHERE IT CAN BE ENJOYED BY ALL.

OUR YEAR IN NUMBERS

OUR NATIONAL PHONE LINE IS AN ESSENTIAL LIFE-LINE FOR THOSE IN CRISIS AND WE REACH MANY FAMILIES AND CHILDREN THROUGH OUR PROJECTS AND HEALTH & COMMUNITY OUTREACH WORK IN SUSSEX AND SURREY.

Nationally, we advocated for **223** clients on **407** different issues.

In Sussex & Surrey we supported **314 families** with **690 different issues**.

We worked at **18 different sites** and **11 encampments and families** in housing.

We helped **61 adults and children** get access to over **£247,000 of benefits** they were entitled to, many for disability and severe medical conditions.

15 people were helped to access training or education

20 adults were supported into paid employment, getting NI numbers and self-employment support with HMRC.

14 people gained RSPH Level II in Understanding Health

We delivered **21 sessions** of training or consultancy to over **50 agencies**.


34 people took part in Health Research

54 children took part in music making activities making **19 recordings**.

Crystal's Vardo has now played to **58 times** to **8,000 people!**



36 people attended **12 focus groups** and panels including health consultation groups on maternity, fairness commission, domestic violence and cancer.
