Gypsies and Travellers Stronger Together

Gypsies and Travellers now have a new link directly into Government.

The new Gypsy and Traveller Liaison Group will now meet with the Minister or his civil servants at least three or four times a year.

All this came out of a meeting back in June, when FFT and other Gypsy and Traveller organisations met with Andrew Stunell MP, then the lead Minister on Race Equality. At the meeting, we voiced our concerns that the Government had not involved Gypsies and



Travellers in making the very policies that most affected them. This particularly applied to the Ministerial Working Group on Gypsies and Travellers. We felt they hadn't got to grips with the key question of site provision or how Gypsies and Travellers might engage in a meaningful way in local authority planning processes now that regional structures have been dismantled.

Most of all, we wanted to establish a regular and meaningful dialogue with Government so that we could input into high level policy discussions before decisions are announced.

It is really good to see all our organisations working together in a coordinated way, and speaking with a coherent and unified voice to influence Government thinking and actions.

The new Gypsy and Traveller Liaison Group

Sparkle of success for Crystal's Vardo!

riends Families and Travellers celebrated Gypsy Roma
Traveller History Month 2012 by launching a new play
for children and young people - Crystal's Vardo - written
by Suzanna King. Its premier performance was at the Pavilion
Theatre Brighton on the 28th June, where it played to a
full house.

The play was born out of a need to develop a project that could help tackle the widespread problem of racist bullying experienced by young Travellers, and raise awareness of Gypsies and Travellers in schools.

Crystal's Vardo was researched and developed over a long period following an initial idea. It centres around Crystal a young Gypsy girl who has been bullied at school. She subsequently runs away aboard her grandfather's vardo only to find herself lost and forced to trust the audience to help her find her way back home.

Something extraordinary happens and Crystal and her companions find themselves far back in time to when the first Gypsies migrated from Northern India, and from hereon they embark on a journey through Traveller history. By piecing together the shards of her ancestry, Crystal regains a confidence in her own identity whilst raising the awareness of her new friends in the audience, and enabling the vardo to find its way back.

Kavanagh-Rose Rattigan plays Crystal, herself of Irish Traveller heritage, and is supported by a cast of two, Neil Thomas and Cara Fraser who play a multitude of roles. The play was a great success, commended and enjoyed by audiences of all ages including a very positive response from the Traveller community.

FFT received funding to run 3 events showcasing the work we have done in partnership with Fire and Rescue Services, Domestic Violence Support and Prison and Probation services.


In June we held a very successful learning event where Fire and Rescue Services came together and presented best practice and learning on GypsyTraveller Fire Safety. From this event we have created a Recommendation Report which gives Fire and Rescue Services information and advice on work with Fire Safety for Gypsies and Travellers.

In July we took part in a

event held by the Domestic
Violence lead for Brighton and
Hove City Council with key
stakeholders including the
Police, Housing and Women's
Domestic Violence Support
organisations. And in
September we are holding
another learning seminar
aimed at Prison and Probation
services which will look at

work carried out in Prisons with Gypsies and Travellers including wellbeing support FFT provide and cultural awareness training taken up by Prison and Probation teams. These events will also create Recommendation Reports on work with Gypsies and Travellers in Prison and Domestic Violence support services.
