This year has once again demonstrated why FFT's work remains so important. At a time when Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities continue to face significant inequalities, discrimination and barriers to opportunity, FFT has remained steadfast in championing rights, promoting inclusion, celebrating culture and supporting communities to thrive.

Over the past year, we have seen the impact that determined advocacy, partnership working and community leadership can achieve. FFT has contributed to important policy developments, including progress towards reversing harmful anti-Traveller legislation, influencing discussions around planning reform and policing powers, and supporting the inclusion of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities within NHS patient data collection. These achievements reflect years of persistence and demonstrate the positive change that can be achieved when communities are heard and represented.

Alongside our policy and campaigning work, FFT has continued to strengthen its influence across the legal, health and criminal justice sectors, ensuring that lived experience helps shape policy, practice and decision-making. We have also continued to celebrate culture, identity and community pride through initiatives such as Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month and the FFT Awards (which took place on 20 April 2026 and sadly fall out of the scope of this annual report – more to come next year!).

The 2025 Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month theme was **“Who Inspires You?”**.

We were invited to reflect on those who make a difference in our lives and communities. It is therefore fitting that we recognise and thank the many people who inspire us every day: our dedicated staff team and leaders, passionate volunteers, valued partners, loyal supporters and fellow campaigners.

Most importantly, we thank the individuals, families and communities whose experiences, resilience and trust continue to guide our work and shape our priorities.

As a Board, we remain committed to ensuring FFT is a strong, sustainable and effective organisation. Chief Executive's Report

Dear reader,

I'm pleased to welcome you to this year's Friends, Families and Travellers (FFT) Annual Report 2026!

This year, a particular focus of our work has been on tackling inequalities that have a long-term impact on the ability of Gypsy and Traveller people to live long and healthy lives.

Whether that's co-developing resources to help healthcare professionals meaningfully engage with Gypsies, Roma, and Travellers, or celebrating NHS England's landmark decision to align patient records with the 2021 census ethnicity categories, after 15 years of tireless campaigning by FFT.

As part of our multi-faceted approach, we're also proud of each of the 27 young Gypsies and Travellers who gained a Level 2 RSPH Young Health Champion qualification this year, through our RSPH work. Along with an educational qualification, this training can help increase young people's confidence in changing habits and behaviours for the better, from within their own communities.

Nationally, we saw a huge win as the Government accepted an amendment to the Crime and Policing Bill (CPB), and now the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act's (PCSCA) 12-month ban has reverted back to the original (pre-PCSCA) 3 months. With planning reforms on the horizon, we also supported more than 100 Gypsy and Traveller people to feed into a government consultation on planning and infrastructure.

We partnered with the Fuel Bank Foundation to help offset fuel costs and provide much-needed gas bottles, electricity vouchers and heating oil, creating real impact on the ground. Over 115 Gypsy and Traveller people accessed our scheme, which covered more than £40,000 worth of tangible support. This was a crucial service, and highlights how important partnerships can be towards making a real difference.

Our Gypsy, Roma and Traveller History Month (GRTHM) theme this year saw us explore the inspiration within; "Gypsy, Roma and Traveller 'Heroes' Month: Who inspires you?". Many stories of courage, ambition and hope came from people from Romany Gypsy, Roma, Irish Traveller, New Traveller, Showman and Liveaboard Boater communities. It was wonderful to see so much inspiration grounded in family and heritage and beautifully demonstrated the richness and diversity of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller people.

To all of our staff, trustees, volunteers and partners, and most importantly, the people we work with and for – thank you for the part you play in our collective strive for a brighter future. We asked the question, 'What inspires you?' for this year's GRTHM theme, and now it's time to give our answer. You are the ones that give FFT its drive for the better, and you show us what it takes to be kind and courageous every day. Together, we continue on the path of dignity, justice, and lasting change.

Our service delivery team helped people **access just under £350,000** of support in the form of welfare benefits, and just over **£100,000 in the form of grants** for a range of essential items including fuel, clothing and much more.



Supported people to get the benefits they are entitled to, totalling almost **£350,000**. This includes PIP, UC, Pension Credit, Housing-related benefits and child DLA.

We supported **11 people** to access a variety of urgent, primary and secondary care services (21 total) where they were having difficulty accessing.

Helped **25 people** gain long term accommodation and **10** to maintain their current accommodation.

Spotlight

ENERGY ACCESS SUPPORT

Winter can be a particularly difficult time for Gypsies and Travellers who continue to travel through the colder months, or who live on Gypsy and Traveller sites and roadside camps. As energy costs have skyrocketed over the last few years, against a backdrop of financial scarcity and the cost-of-living-crisis, the pain and difficulties continue to compound. Without the proper support, winter can be an extremely isolating time.

We have previously written about the [extensive costs](#) that families and individuals living on sites, roadside camps and canals are exposed to, with many paying more than people who live in bricks and mortar for effectively the same, if not less, energy access.

To offer some respite, we partnered with the [Fuel Bank Foundation](#) to help ensure Gypsy and Traveller people can access vital support with fuel costs, gas bottles, electricity vouchers and heating oil.

Through the scheme:

- ✿ **More than 115 Gypsy and Traveller people received support with heating costs.**
- ✿ **We issued almost 190 grants for support and public health messaging.**
- ✿ **Covered over £40,490 worth of gas bottles, electricity vouchers and heating oil costs.**

We are incredibly grateful to the Fuel Bank Foundation for helping us provide such a crucial service, at a time when many social improvement programmes face devastating cuts.

DENTAID

FFT partnered up with DentAid to help deliver free dental care to site residents in Brighton. This included a range of support such as tooth extraction, hygienist appointments, and general oral health advice, for Gypsy and Traveller people of all ages. The feedback has been great and we're hoping to roll out the model across Sussex in the near future!



Supporting Needs

Romany Gypsies, Roma and Irish Travellers face some of the poorest health and education outcomes of any minority ethnic groups in the UK, contributing to a cycle of inequality—a cycle often experienced by communities with shared traits of nomadic living, including New Travellers, Showmen and Liveaboard Boaters. To tackle the issues at the root, we run workshops, training and supported employability opportunities for young people, and offering information and advice to families.

CHAMPIONING HEALTHIER LIVES

We have continued to build on our RSPH Young Health Champions programme. Working closely with partners like London Gypsies and Travellers, 27 young Gypsies and Travellers now hold a Level 2 RSPH Young Health Champion qualification. These health champions will go on to tackle health and wellbeing disparities within their own communities.

CONSULTING COMMUNITIES

We submitted evidence to the Government consultation on planning reforms, drawing on the experiences of more than 100 Gypsy and Traveller people. We went a step further and created an [accessible, community-led resource](#) to support direct responses from Gypsies and Travellers, with over 30 Gypsies and Traveller engaging directly with the consultation. This work keeps Gypsy and Traveller accommodation needs at the top of the agenda and can help effectively influence emerging policy proposals.



GIFTING SEASON

Our Season's Giftings campaign once again spread holiday cheer to Gypsies and Travellers across Sussex, with over 60 families receiving toys, food, or a gas bottle and helping take some pressure out of daily life. Throughout our work, we aim to explore new and innovative ways of supporting people from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities, and our Season's Giftings campaign is one of our favourites!

HEALTHCARE FOR ALL

We created a [one-stop shop](#) for healthcare professionals supporting Gypsy, Roma and Traveller people, offering co-developed advice and insights. From leaflets to videos, our resources are designed to support both individuals and healthcare professionals so effective and culturally pertinent care can be available at the point of access.

INFORMING DECISIONS

We produced a [series of eight animated short films](#) offering clear, accessible information on vaccinations for people from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities. We believe resources like these can help address stark health inequalities and gaps in health education. The films were co-developed with people from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities, in partnership with the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) and Roma Support Group (RSG).



Challenging Laws and Policies

Tackling inequality requires action across systems; on the frontline, on the front benches, and at the 'table'. At FFT, we adopt a multi-pronged approach, from our Service Delivery Team's outreach to our Development Team's national projects, to our policy, public affairs and national campaigning work.

NHS DATA DICTIONARY

NHS England has taken a significant positive step by [recommending that health bodies](#) across the UK include Gypsy, Roma, and Traveller people in patient data, aligning records with the 2021 census, in cases where "the design of a new product cannot wait until the joint...standards are published". This landmark decision is the result of 15 years of tireless campaigning by FFT, alongside many dedicated activists and partners.

DEFENDING GYPSY AND TRAVELLER RIGHTS

After our legal tussling, the Government accepted an amendment to the [Crime and Policing Bill](#) (CPB), in a major win for Gypsy and Traveller communities. As one of the most draconian forms of anti-Traveller legislation in decades, the [Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act's](#) (PCSCA) **12-month** ban has now reverted back to the original (pre-PCSCA) **3 months**, since the CPB passed through parliament in April 2026.

WORKING TOGETHER TO EFFECT CHANGE

In partnership with GATE Herts, we organised a parliamentary event focused on improving support for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller victims and survivors of domestic abuse. The event brought together parliamentarians, sector organisations and community members to share evidence and lived experience, highlighting barriers to accessing support.

RAISING THE ALARM

Following the devastating [fire at the Ver Meadows site](#), we called on the Government to improve fire safety measures on Gypsy and Traveller sites along with greater investment in site infrastructure. We also brought attention to the exclusion of site residents from key housing standards and protections, including through work on the [Decent Homes Standard](#). Through highlighting poor site conditions at the national level, we strengthen our calls for equal standards, protections, and investment in Gypsy and Traveller communities.

GYPSY TRAVELLER LAW NETWORK

FFT supported the launch of the new '[Gypsy and Traveller Law Network](#)' (GTLN), made up of legal professionals representing Gypsy and Traveller clients, specialising in accommodation and site matters. This work can be life-changing for people seeking legal support, and GTLN will run training, events, legal briefings and more.



Cultures and Histories

GYPSY, ROMA AND TRAVELLER 'HEROES' MONTH

2025's GRTHM theme was *"Gypsy, Roma and Traveller 'Heroes' Month: Who inspires you?"*, which explored the stories behind some of the incredible people who make up Romany Gypsy, Roma, Irish Traveller, New Traveller, Showman, and Liveaboard Boater communities. As part of our GRTHM work, we create brochures and booklets for schools and prisons, a digital engagement pack, and a beloved competition!

TRAVELLING TALES

This year, Crystal's Vardo focused on performances in churches, with a launch at the Gypsy, Roma, Traveller Friendly Churches Conference at Salisbury Cathedral in May, followed by a series of performances, with an audience of approximately 700 people! We also delivered a performance at the Beamish Museum, an open-air living museum in County Durham, with support from the Church of England. By focusing on new spaces and audiences, we continue to tackle hate and increase people's knowledge of the histories and cultures of Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities!

KUSHTI COLLABORATIVE

Our Kushti Collaborative Pan Sussex Project came to an end in 2026, after three years of delivering heritage crafts and wellbeing events, including basket weaving, blacksmithing and horseshoe painting groups. We welcomed around 250 Gypsy and Traveller people at our Stoneywish community day, alongside a well-attended Christmas event in our hometown, Brighton. All our activities were co-designed with community members, helping to build confidence, reduce isolation and strengthen connection across Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities!





We continue to focus on delivering meaningful projects for long-term change for **the benefit of Irish Traveller, Romany Gypsy, Roma and Traveller communities.**

TRAPPED IN THE TURNSTILE: ONE YEAR ON

Following our landmark [*Trapped in the Turnstile report*](#), released in 2024, FFT joined the HMPPS Race and Disparities Unit 3rd Sector Advisory Group and continued to influence policy and practice by engaging with over 130 EDI and Gypsy, Roma and Traveller leads in prisons. Alongside establishing direct engagement with over 150 Gypsies, Roma and Travellers across 21 prisons, FFT has been part of important discussions Lord Timpson, Minister of State for Prisons, Parole and Probation, on the impact of the Sentencing Act 2026.

NATIONAL MATERNITY AND NEONATAL INVESTIGATION

Through co-designed family evidence panels and tailored support delivered alongside Roma Support Group, 29 Gypsies, Travellers, and Roma shared experiences of maternity care as part of the major National Maternity and Neonatal Investigation (NMNI). The project identified barriers to specialist psychological support, with 10 participants going on to access vital therapy sessions through PAM Group.

TACKLING THE 'BAD THING'

In partnership with the Northeast London Cancer Alliance (NELCA), 13 Health Champions from Roma, Irish Traveller and New Traveller communities are now equipped to promote cancer awareness and access to screening services from within their communities. Feedback showed confidence in discussing cancer screening increased from 58% to over 90%, and the project was nominated as a regional champion in the NHS Excellence Awards.
